

March 24: We pray for the Mission of Embu/Kianjokoma, and ask for the progress of our mission at Mt. Kenya and that more congregations will open in our area.

March 25: We pray for the Congregation of Ukambani, and that those still practicing traditional religion come to a deeper understanding of Christianity so that they can accept it into their daily lives .

March 26: We pray for the Missions of Kajiado and Lunga Lunga, that our people will be provided with clean water and that dams will be constructed to collect water.

March 27: We pray for adequate supplies of corn porridge to alleviate the hunger of our people .



March 28: SUNDAY – As your Son entered into Jerusalem and heard the people shouting out “Hosanna!” may we join in their praise. Let it be unceasing until your return.

March 29: We pray for the Mission of Kajiado, and that the three nursery schools in our area obtain adequate medicine and Insecticide Treated Nets.

March 30: We pray for the Mission of Ngurumani, and that Maasai people of our region, especially the women. We pray that women will find freedom from traditional practices that keep them oppressed, such as FGM, and that women will be granted more equality. We pray that the children will be able to obtain education. We pray that the men and youth will come to church instead of just the women.

March 31: We pray for the Congregation of Malindi, and for the cessation of hostilities and healing of the rift between the group that supports the previous pastor and the group that supports the new pastor.

April 1: We pray that the congregation will start being self-sufficient and move beyond the mentality of dependence on missionaries

April 2: We pray that all of our congregations will obtain buildings for worship. One congregation still worships under a tree, and one was evicted from its building by an Arab trader. The case is in court; we pray for a successful resolution of the dispute

April 3: We are thankful for the growth of the mission in the region; there are two parishes with 23 congregations and one mission area.



April 4: We give thanks for the drinking well project and our partnership with Rantzau/Munsterdorf in Germany.
