Announcement:
The words I speak this morning recall Jesus' words of command and promise spoken over the
elements at 's table, and they are not to be understood as a consecration of the
elements.
At the time of the meal in the liturgy:
"When the congregation of''s gathered for the celebration of Holy Communion, they
heard again the story of God's mighty acts and love made flesh through the birth, death, and
resurrection of our Lord Jesus. With thanksgiving, they remembered that "in the night in which Jesus
was betrayed, he took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples saying: Take and eat this is my body given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.
Again, after supper he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink saying: This cup is the
new covenant in my blood, shed for you and all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the
remembrance of me."
They were given the assurance of our Lord's presence through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Now I
bring to you the same bread of life and the same cup of blessing from your sister congregation,
that you may be strengthened through your participation in the body of Christ.
